

Partnerships for Scholar Advancement



In 2017, IIE-SRF launched the **Partnerships for Scholar Advancement (PSA)**, a network of partner organizations and individuals committed to providing IIE-SRF scholars (current fellows and alumni) with opportunities for career advancement and professional development during and after their IIE-SRF fellowships. PSA connects participating scholars to opportunities through a network of institutions and individual partners across the academic, not-for-profit, and corporate sectors.

PSA has been building a core group of partners that includes more than 15 institutions.

In the U.S., partner institutions include, but are not limited to:

- **American Academy of Religion, American Association for the Advancement of Science, American Historical Association, Central Eurasian Studies Society, Midwest Political Science Association, and National Academy of Sciences**, among other academic societies;
- **Coursera** (through the Coursera for Refugees initiative);
- **ELS Language Centers**;
- **Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld LLP and Willkie Farr Gallagher LLP**; and
- **Global Young Academy**

Across Europe, PSA's most notable partners are the **GREET** and **BRIDGE** programs.

IIE-SRF also partners with over 50 individuals who offer their expertise and advice to IIE-SRF scholars directly. These **Advisorships** are one-on-one relationships between an Advisor and an IIE-SRF scholar with the purpose of supplementing career advancement and professional development efforts. Advisorships are among the most effective ways for displaced scholars to work through impediments to securing longer-term positions and opportunities in academia and related sectors.

Possible Advisorship roles include:

- Assisting with editing CVs, resumes, and cover letters and/or conducts mock interviews
- Reviewing teaching statements, grant and post-doctoral applications, or other academic writing
- Providing career advice and guidance
- Introducing the scholar to discipline-specific connections, thus extending her or his network
- Bringing attention to academic, publishing, and job opportunities in the scholars' academic field(s)
- Helping the scholar build her/his academic presence by sharing information about relevant conferences and membership of academic societies

More than 55 scholars have been paired with Advisors, resulting in:

- Memberships in academic societies
- Book and article editing and publications
- Jobs, fellowships
- Attendance and presentations at conferences
- Admission to Ph.D. programs

IIE-SRF launched PSA as a pilot initiative focused on U.S.- and Canada-based institutions and scholars in the STEM fields. The initiative has since expanded to cover all fields of study and to support Europe-based scholars. Since 2017, over 120 IIE-SRF scholars have benefited from different opportunities offered by PSA.
